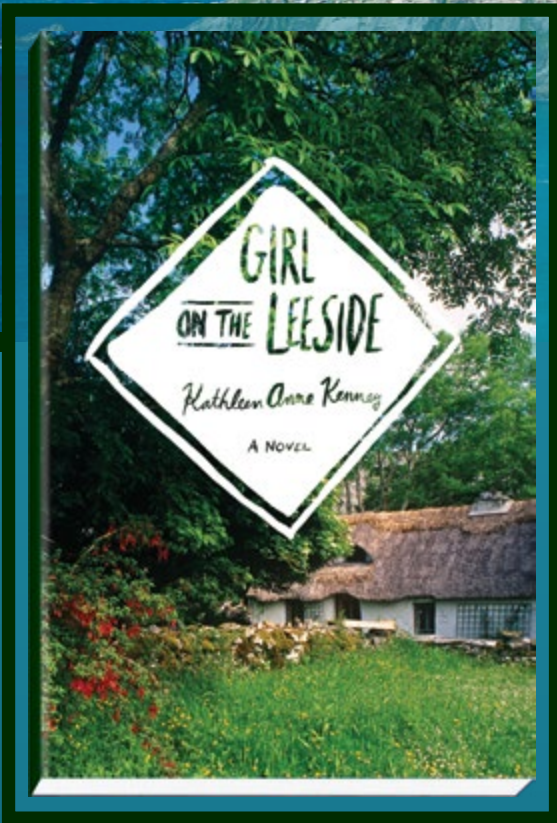


# Girl on the Leaside
